say?



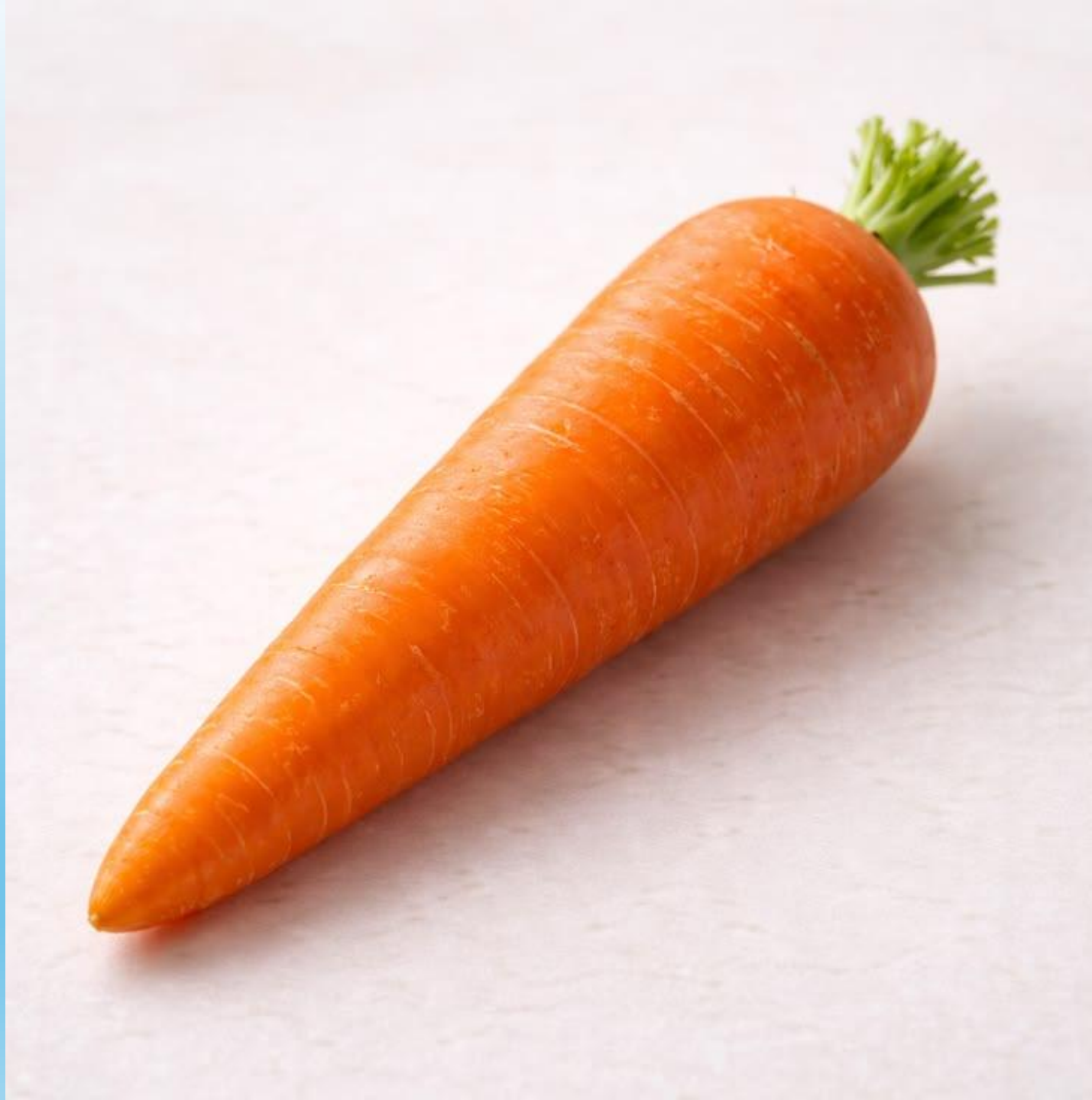
We say a brocha
